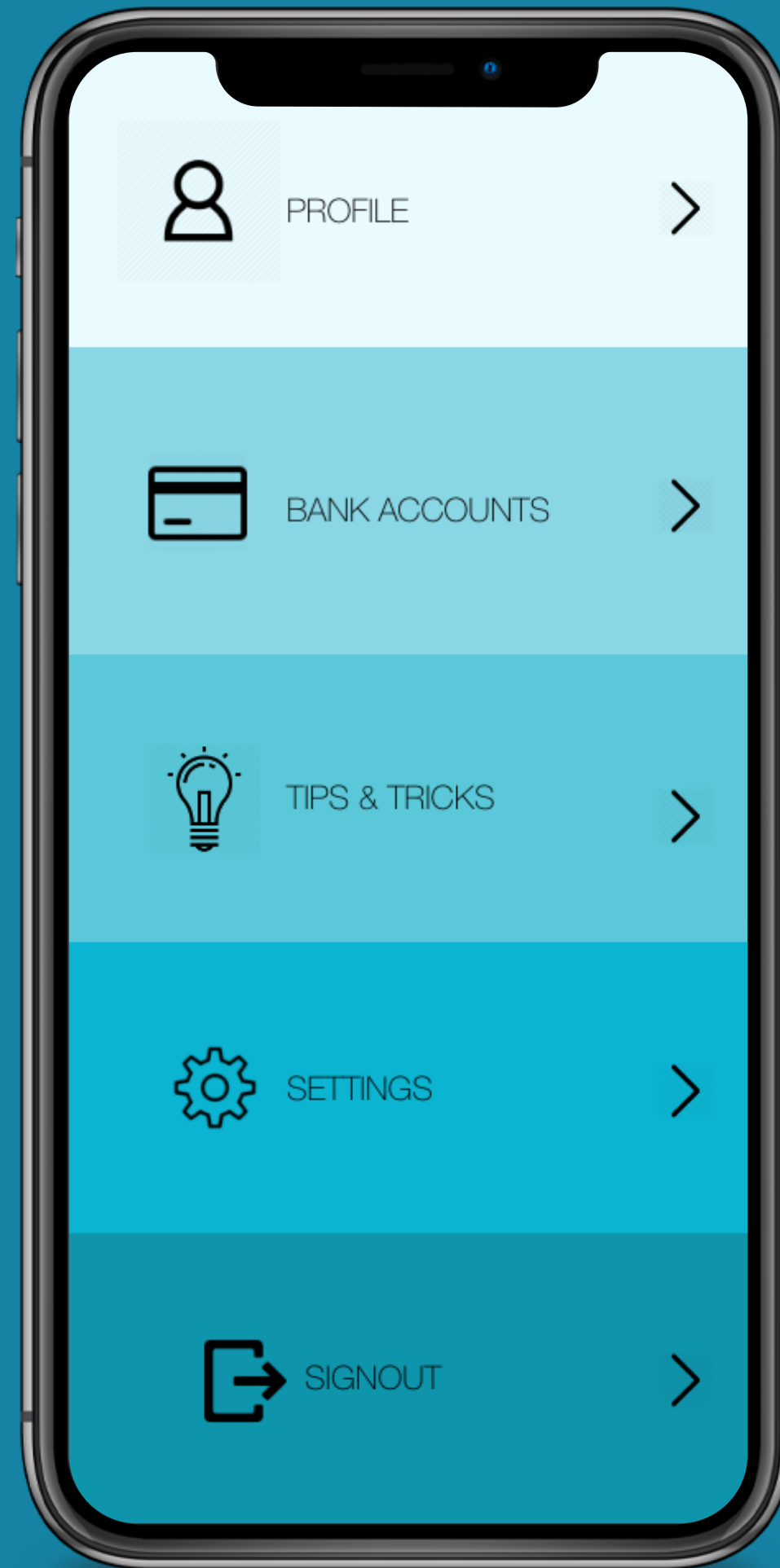




## Accounts: Budget + Save

A money management app made easy for college students and recent graduates. When the user opens the app, they will have the option to either sign in or create a new account.

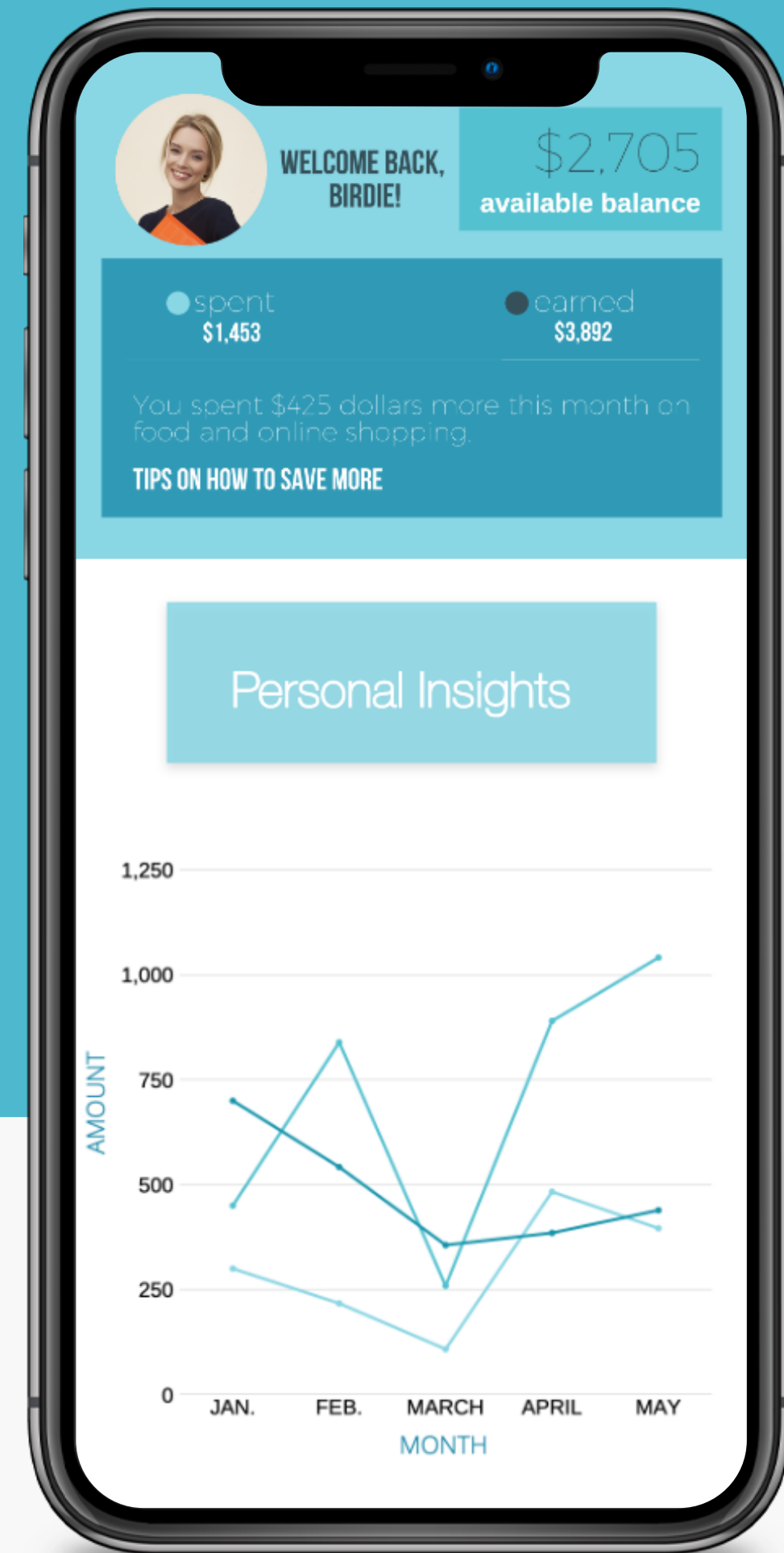
# SETTINGS

# PROFILE

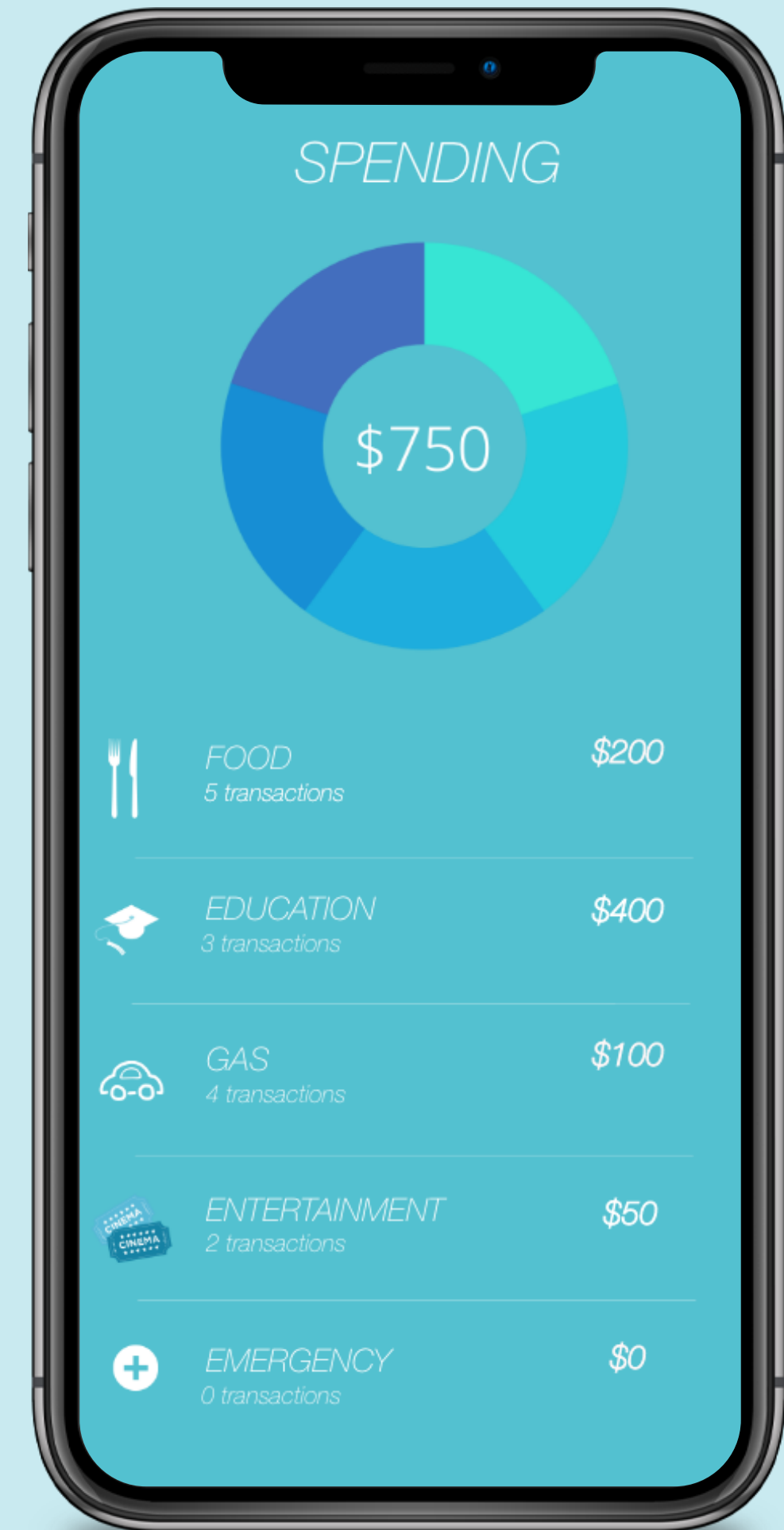
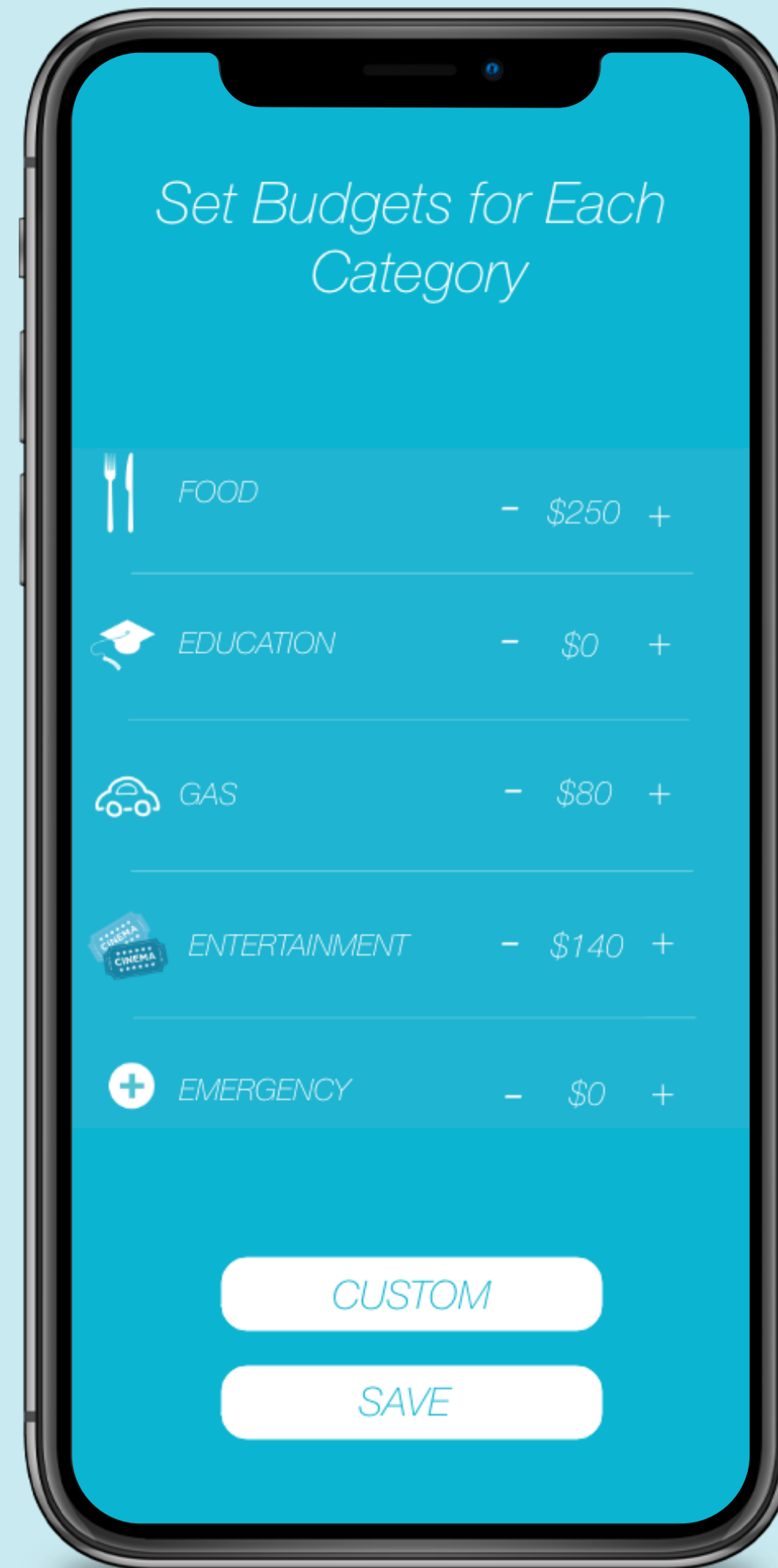

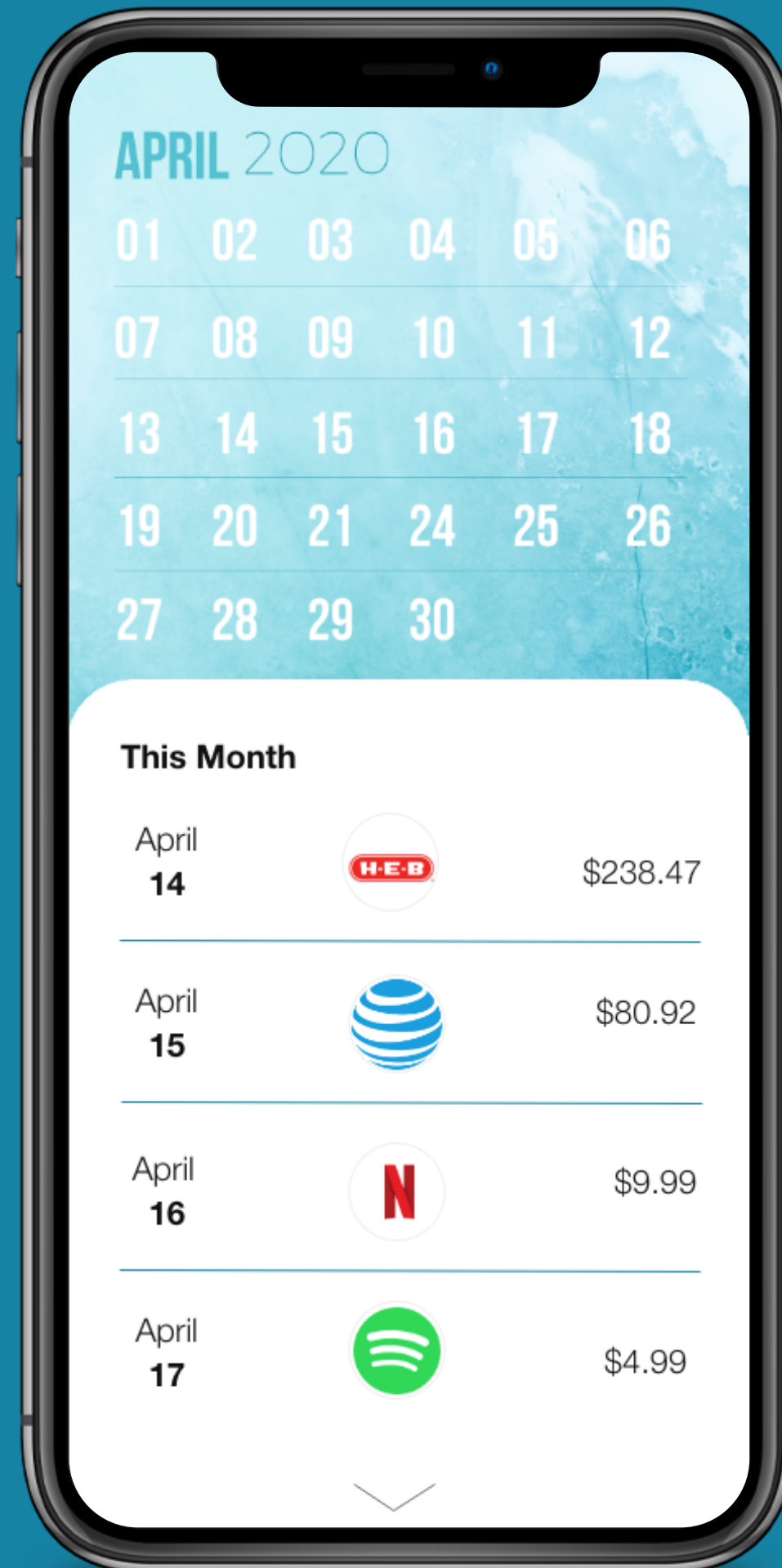
# BUDGET MAKER

**Right Screen:** This is an overview of how much the user has spent in each category and how many transactions they have made within that category.



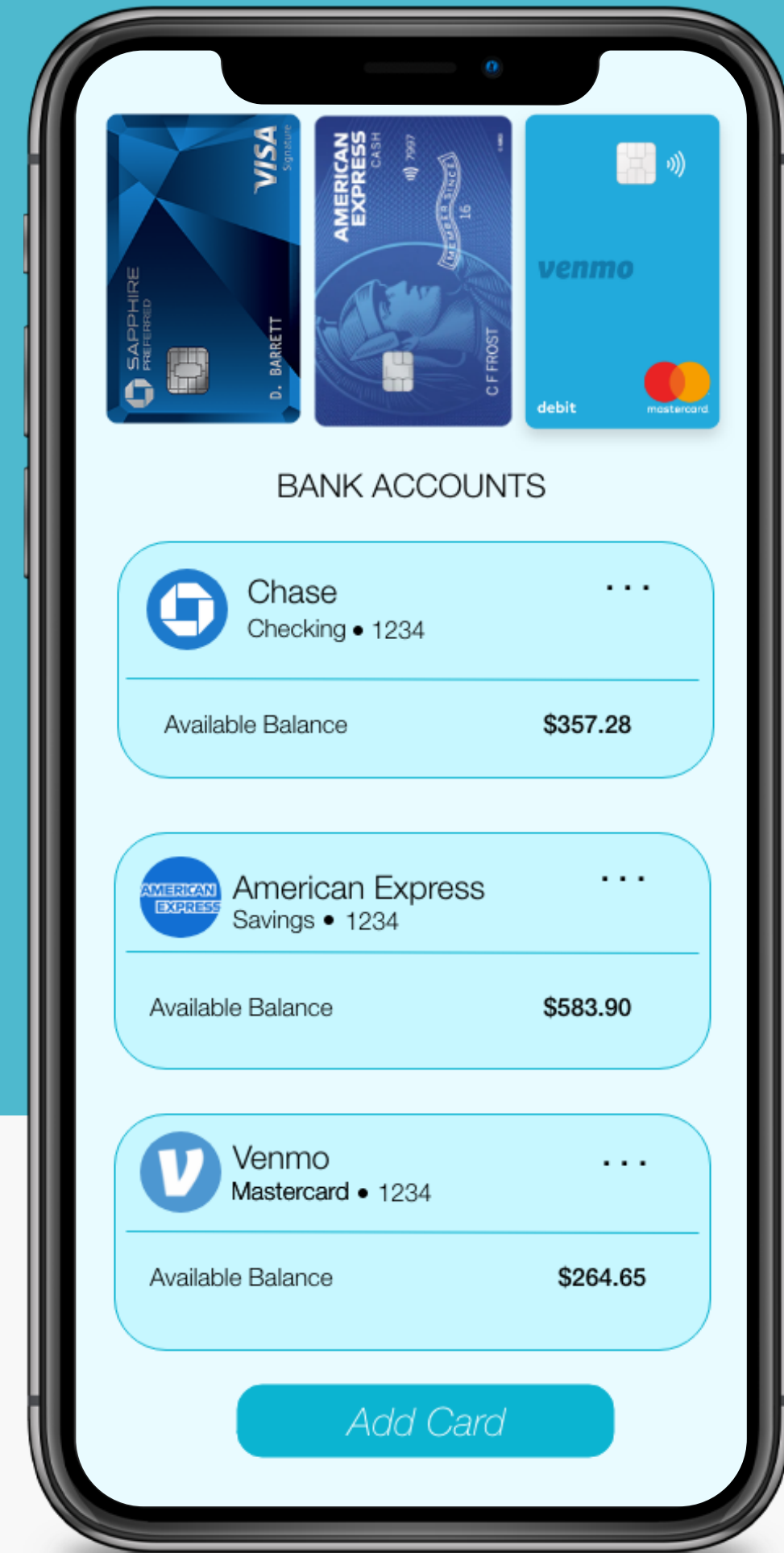
# CALENDAR

# BANK ACCOUNTS

# CALCULATOR + ARTICLES

**Left Screen:** The calculator allows the user to create their own monthly budget. If they pick custom, then the app will generate a monthly budget based on their spending. The categories tab lets the user set a budget for food, entertainment, gas, etc.
